\*According to Section 2953.32 division (A)(1)(g) of the Ohio Revised Code, felonies of the third degree (F3) CANNOT be sealed or expunged: "if the offender has more than one other conviction of any felony or, if the person has exactly two convictions of a felony of the third degree, has more convictions in total than those two third degree felony convictions and two misdemeanor convictions."
